Each day is a waiting game of wondering who's delivering the meal today – whose smiling, friendly face will I see? I can't imagine what that must feel like. Can you?

What doesn't move fast at Meals on Wheels is the waiting list for service. The waitlist is like working a giant jigsaw puzzle. All the pieces must fit. Who needs the service most? Which routes have space? Will current drivers be willing to drive an extra 15 minutes? Will new volunteers step up? Is the funding available?

Jacqueline is a piece of that puzzle. Jacqueline was recently added to our home delivered meal program. She had been waiting for our home delivery service for over two months. She is faced with many challenges. She has a prosthetic which makes it hard to stand to prepare food. She has no refrigerator. She does not drive. She does not have family in the area. During her assessment, when asked about isolation, she began to cry. We have added Jacqueline to the program. She now says the volunteers who deliver her meal every day is a gift.

Looking ahead, there's a strong sense of urgency. Keeping pace with the increased need of volunteers and funding can be a challenge. The impact of our program goes well beyond the dollars attached to a meal. The priceless moments of human connection are seen in the smiles, heard in the laughter and felt in the hearts of those we serve each day.

No one plans to need the services offered by Pickens County Meals on Wheels, but the effects of aging, illness, isolation and/or diminishing resources does not discriminate. The confidence our community places in our program is astounding. It is because of caring people like you that we can carry out our mission every day. This holiday season, I challenge you to reach deep in your heart and become a solution to our puzzle. 
