A Word From Your Executive Director

Pickens County Meals on Wheels (PCMOW) continues to grow and expand its reach to seniors throughout our county. **Our board, staff and community leaders are eagerly awaiting the opening of PCMOW's third Young at Heart Senior Center.** We have been working with the YMCA of Easley in uplifting

a portion of the prior YMCA building at 201 Burns Road, Easley. We predict the opening to be mid-August. Additional opening details will be announced closer to the date.

The construction is 75% complete and moving forward with electrical, sheetrock and ceilings giving a true feeling of the actual space we will be occupying. I am starting to feel anxious and excited to promote the new center and expand our senior services to the Easley community. This particular site will be one of our largest locations. Once open, we will offer activities that will allow older adults to connect, thrive and enjoy a range of programs and services – from nutritious meals and fitness classes to social activities, educational workshops, and more.

Most importantly, our new Young at Heart senior center will be a place of friendship, support, and belonging. Franklin, who currently attends one of our centers, credits our senior program with turning his life around. He calls his new friends at the senior center his family and remarks about how everyone cares for him, making him feel so loved and valued. When we recently celebrated his birthday, he became emotional at the wishes given to him and stated that this was the first birthday party he had ever been given. He hardly misses a day attending the center activities.

Just as important, PCMOW's home delivered meal program faces the harsh reality of the increasing number of seniors reaching out for support. The overwhelming requests for meal delivery service, a friendly safety check and companionship are heartbreaking and troublesome. The reality is that so many seniors in our community are living alone, with limited income and no family nearby. Some of these folks have not had a visitor in days.

Others quietly go without meals. The demand for our home delivered meal services is growing each day.

When 84-year-old Mrs. Nealy lost her husband of 60 years, her world became painfully quiet. With limited mobility and no family nearby, simple things like grocery shopping or preparing a hot meal became overwhelming. "I used to sit at the window," she says, "watching the hours go by, wondering if anyone remembered I was still here." Then one day, there was a knock at her door. It was our PCMOW volunteer, smiling and holding a warm plate of food. "At first, I didn't know what to say," she recalls. "But they didn't just drop off the meal – they asked me how I was doing. They listened."

There are more senior neighbors like Mrs. Nealy waiting.

Whether you donate, volunteer, or simply share this message, you are bringing kindness to a neighbor's doorstep. That warm meal that is delivered says "You matter. You are not forgotten."

Together, we can make sure no senior in our community goes hungry or feels alone. On behalf of our board, staff and most importantly, those we serve, we thank you!!

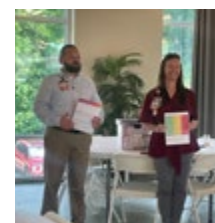

Young at Heart

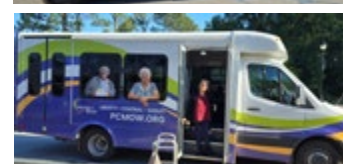

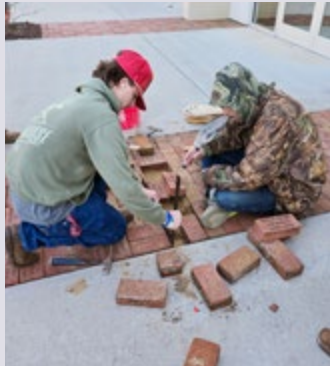

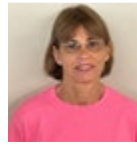

Senior Farmers’ Market Nutrition Program Offers \$50 in Fresh Produce Coupons to Eligible Seniors

Pickens County seniors, don’t miss this opportunity! If you are 60 years of age or older and meet income requirements, you may qualify to receive \$50 in coupons to use at authorized farmers’ markets this summer. These coupons can be used to purchase fresh, unprocessed fruits and vegetables grown by local farmers.

This benefit is offered through the Senior Farmers’ Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP)—a seasonal USDA-funded program that supports senior health and local agriculture.

To be eligible, applicants must be at least 60 years old at the time of application, meet low-income guidelines, live in Pickens County, and present proof of identity when picking up their vouchers. Participants must apply each year to receive benefits.

Applications will be accepted June 2 through June 30, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. at the McKissick Center for Senior Wellness, located at 349 Edgemont Avenue in Liberty.

If you’re unable to visit the McKissick Center, there are also several pop-up voucher distribution events scheduled throughout the county:

- **Wednesday, June 4, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.** at The Storehouse at 5 Point Church, 1021 S Pendleton Street, Easley.
- **Thursday, June 5, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.** at Clemson Community Care, 105 Anderson Highway, Clemson.
- **Monday, June 9, from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.** at the Senior Center at Hagood Community Center, 129 Schoolhouse Road, Pickens.
